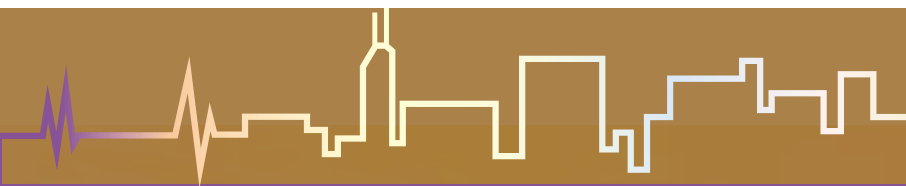

Call for Abstracts

Participants are invited to submit abstracts for the Conference that will be published in Europe and / or equivalent international journal. Submissions covering all topics related to cardiac rhythm including basic and clinical researches, and interesting case reports and series are welcome. Presenters are allowed to submit more than one abstract. 6 abstracts will be selected to receive either **Young Investigator Award** (Prize: US\$500) or **Best Paper Award** (Prize: US\$1,000). The awards are donated by Sun Chien Yeh Heart Foundation.

Abstracts must be written in English. The content should include: i) Background & Objectives, ii) Methods, iii) Results and iv) Conclusion. Please clearly type the title of the abstract, author name(s), institution name(s), and country of origin at the top of the abstract. The name of the presenting author should be underlined. The abstract should not exceed 250 words. It is recommended you use a computer-generated, Times New Roman, 10-point font, with single-line spacing. Abstract submission **MUST** be done on-line. Please follow the instructions on www.cardiorhythm.com. The deadline for submission is **3 October 2008**, and notification of acceptance will be sent out by **7 November 2008**. All free paper presenters are required to register with the Conference for presenting their works.

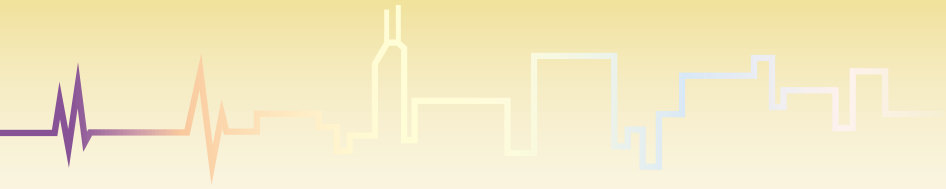

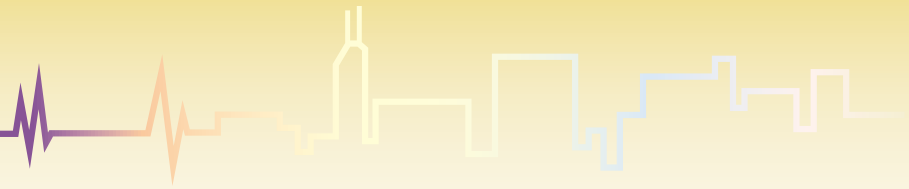

Information on Tours

Hong Kong is a vibrant city with exciting and diversified sights for all tourists. The nearby city of Macau is an attractive day-visit destination. There is so much to do in such a small area.

Hong Kong Island Tour (9am - 1:30pm)

Fee: USD29 per person (No lunch)

Pass through Causeway Bay, the Suzie Wong district of Wanchai, and Happy Valley where the horseracing tracks are located. Followed with the scenic area of Deep Water Bay and Repulse Bay with its splendid beaches. Next stop will be Stanley Market, which is great for bargain hunting and Aberdeen to see fishermen and their families on hundreds of junks and sampans. The tour will be completed with a final stop of Victoria Peak, famous with its breathtaking skyscrapers. As an extra attraction, a visit will be made to a jewelry workshop for a behind-the-scene look at the fine craftsmanship of jewelry making in the orient.



The Land between New Territories Tour (9am - 2pm)

Away from the maddening pace of the city, this tour offers a glimpse of the rural and traditional Hong Kong. Visit the Yuen Yuen Institute, a large monastery complex housing the three predominant local religious Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism. Afterwards, go to Tai Mo Shan, Hong Kong's highest mountain for spectacular panoramic views of surrounding areas. Next stop is where you need binoculars. In the distance lies the border village of Sha Tau Kok and nearby a protected bird sanctuary where Chinese Pond Herons, Night Herons and the rare swinnoe's Egrets can be seen. Final stop at a fish-farming zone at Sam Mun Tsai and lunch will be served at Sha Tin racecourse.



A day to an outer island "Lantau Tour" (8:30am - 4:30pm)

Pick up from hotel and board on an hour ferry to Silver Mine Bay on Lantau, which is twice the size of Hong Kong Island. On arrival, disembark for a 5-hour coach tour of the island including visits to Cheungsha beach, Tai-O fishing village and see the world's tallest outdoor seated bronze Buddha on the top of Lantau Peak. A vegetarian lunch is served in the Monastery, followed by guided tour to the "Walking with Buddha" in the culturally themed Ngong Ping Village before transfer back to hotels.

Information on Hong Kong

Bank

Major banks are open from 9am to 4:30pm Monday to Friday, and 9am to 12:30pm on Saturday. They close on Sundays and public holidays.

Currency

Legal tender is the Hong Kong Dollar (HKD). There are 100 cents in a dollar. Coins, issued by the government, are bronze-colored for 10 cents, 20 cents and 50 cents; silver-colored for HKD1, HKD2, HKD5, nickel and bronze for HKD10. Notes issued by HSBC and Standard Chartered Bank have denominations of HKD10, HKD20, HKD50, HKD100, HKD500 and HKD1000. The Bank of China issues all of the denominations except HKD10.

Electricity

The standard electrical voltage in HK is 220 volts AC, 50HZ, so you will need an adaptor for your 100-volt appliances and electrical equipment. The majority of electrical outlets in Hong Kong take a three-pronged plug. You can buy an inexpensive adaptor for your equipment when you arrive in Hong Kong.

Exchange Rates

Since the mid-1980s, the value of the Hong Kong dollar has been pegged at HKD7.8 to the US dollar, and consequent rates of exchange to other currencies. However, the market rate exchange to the US dollar fluctuates marginally. Banks and money changers charge commission. Similarly, commissions are payable in hotels and major retail outlets which provide exchange facilities for their customers.

Mobile Services

Using your mobile phone in Hong Kong is convenient as most of the telephone systems used around the globe - like GSM 900, PCS 1800, CDMA and WCDMA - operate in Hong Kong. Mobile operators in Hong Kong also have roaming agreements with most overseas operators enabling visitors to use their own mobile phone when they come to Hong Kong. Before leaving home check with your network provider to make sure they have a roaming service to the various destinations you will be visiting and be sure to check pricing.

Opening Hours

The vast majority of shops are open every day throughout the year, some only closing during the Chinese New Year holiday. Generally, opening hours are 10am - 7pm. However many stores in busy retail areas like Causeway Bay and Tsim Sha Tsui stay open until 9:30pm or even later, particularly on weekends. Shops in Central close as early as 7pm.

Tips

Most restaurants will levy a 10% service charge but waiters will expect to be given some loose change. Restaurants that don't add a service charge will expect a 10% tip. However, tipping is left to your discretion. Bellboys, porters, restroom attendants and taxi drivers will happily accept loose change.

Transportation

Public transportation via bus, ferry or train is efficient, relatively inexpensive and user-friendly. The system covers extension areas of Hong Kong with signs in English and Chinese. Airport Express links between Hong Kong International Airport and Hong Kong's vibrant Central business hub. All the Airport Express stations include an In-town Check-in desk and regular Airport Express Shuttle Bus services. For details of train service, please visit www.mtr.com.hk.

Weather

Hong Kong has a subtropical climate with distinct seasons. In February, the weather is cool with lower humidity. Temperature ranges from 14° to 20°C. Occasional chills make woollens and overcoats worth bringing.
